Good News: More Funding in the 2024 Budget for Problem Areas

More money for anti-Semitism prevention, youth work and clinics - that's what Berlin is planning for the next two years. In November, the Berlin coalition presented the double budget for 2024/2025. An additional 42 million euros are to flow into youth work and youth leisure facilities. In the health sector, Berlin's coalition also wants to invest an additional 42 million euros in hospitals. The state also wants to support projects to prevent anti-Semitism with an additional 25 million euros.

Prayer: Thank God for more money for Berlin's young people, financial help for Berlin's health system and investments in projects to prevent anti-Semitism - especially with a view to the escalation in the Middle East

Christmas in Times of War

It's not directly with us here, but it is quite close to us: the war in Ukraine and in Israel/Gaza. How do we deal with it when it's "peace on earth" again at Christmas? We have less peace at present than for quite some time. In February 2022, the Chancellor spoke of a turning point. But the birth of the Saviour in Bethlehem was also a turning point: God comes to us as a human being on earth. Since then, everything has been different. There is hope for the most hopeless cases. There is peace with God. There is reconciliation even for enemies. That's why, despite all the setbacks and the long war against Ukraine, it's worth praying for peace. That's why it's worth shouting the message of reconciliation with God and subsequently between people loudly into the ears and hearts of the Berlin population at Christmas 2023. Where else could we find personal peace and comfort but with Jesus, the child in the manger, the Saviour on the cross and the living Lord?

Prayer:

- Pray that peace would come soon in Ukraine and between Israel and Gaza
- Pray that the Christmas message would be preached in a powerful and credible way in churches
- Pray that Berliners will find Jesus as their Lord

Problems Feared on New Year's Eve

Senator for Economic Affairs Franziska Giffey expressed her fears of renewed New Year's Eve riots to the "Tagesspiegel". The conflicts of this world also play out on our streets and schoolyards. But Berlin is better prepared for it this year. The situation should be defused by a larger number of firecrackers ban zones.

Prayer:

- Pray for sensible regulations that can also be implemented
- Pray for protection for police and rescue workers from firecrackers and rockets
- Pray for protection against injuries in general and against aggressive riots

Prayer for the Districts: Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg

The Evangelical Alliance Berlin and Together for Berlin are praying for a specific district each month in 2023. In December it is Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg's turn.

The double district is colorful, loud and crowded: 293,231 people live here in an area of just 20.34 km². This makes it the district with the highest population density and the lowest average age. It is known as a hotspot for the creative scene and for its intercultural diversity. In the last few decades there has been a profound structural change in the form of gentrification. Demand now far exceeds supply on the housing market. The few available apartments in many neighbourhoods are advertised at such high prices that they are only affordable for the upper middle and upper classes. A few blocks away (e.g., around the Kottbusser Tor) two thirds of the families live dependent on state benefits. The district is struggling with a variety of social problems: Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg had the most drug-related deaths in Berlin in 2022 (41; in 2021 there were 24). Homelessness is also a problem in the district, for example there have been tent camps on the Landwehr Canal for years. Clara Herrmann from the Greens has been the district mayor since December 2021. Other city councilors are Oliver Nöll (Left Party, Work & Social Affairs), Annika Gerold (Green Party, Transport & Environment), Florian Schmidt (Green Party, Building) Andy Hehmke (SPD, School & Sport) and Max Kindler (CDU, Youth & Family).

Prayer:

- Pray for wisdom for politicians to address social problems and ensure balance between different groups
- Pray for good coexistence between cultures, especially in view of the current Middle East conflict; Pray for protection for Jewish life
- Pray for powerful cooperation between churches in order to build the Kingdom of God together; Pray that youth work will be strengthened

The New Senate Members: Senator for Science, Health and Home Care, Dr. Ina Czyborra, SPD

We are introducing the new Senate members of the CDU-SPD coalition in a series.

Ina Czyborra has been Ulrike Gote's successor since April 27, 2023. She is 57 years old, married and has three children. She studied archeology and worked in various museums and excavation projects. So, she is very new to her current area of responsibility. She is being supported by State Secretaries Ellen Haußdörfer and Dr. Henry Marx. Major challenges lie in the shortage of skilled workers in nursing. She would like to recognize foreign qualifications more quickly and advance the planned training camp for nursing professions at the Wenckebach Clinic in Tempelhof. The Berlin home visits pilot project has been running in seven districts together with the Maltesers since 2021.
